For a fact the FDA has the authority to totally control the permissible activities of Doctors, Hospitals, Clinics, Medical Device manufacturers etc. For years the FDA banned the use of silicone implants in the USA even though it was eventually proven that the alleged silicone implant health risks were non-existant. About 2 years ago the FDA reversed their silicone ban, based on an extremely expensive study funded by the US implant manufacturers and others, and aided by leading medical colleges and institutions. String implants have not received any such support or financial backing, and very probably never will.

At the moment, to the best of my knowledge, the only implants FDA approved for general use by any US plastic surgeon are those implants listed in the catalog of US Implant manufacturers Mentor and McGhan Medical. The FDA has also approved a clinical trial of implants manufactured by the US division of Silimed, although these are only

> available to a limited number of patients through a limited number of plastic surgeons who are participating in the trial.

About string implant maintenance for myself or any other girl who currently has string implants, all I can tell you is that I received the same alternative as your friend did, to have my string implants replaced with conventional ones. So, like your friend, I'm just hanging in there and hoping no complications develop with my own string implants because I also love them! 
