

What is your genre preference? These days it's Gothic/Deathrock/ Darkwave/Minimal (kinda hard to sum it up in one solid genre).


Considering you are quite the international traveling dj do you seem to find any Countries or cities that seem to be more receptive of you and your music?




Are you originally from Champaign IL. and if not what brought you to the area?

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

Interview with founder Brent D. Wisdom

- 1. what got you into role playing? A friend of mine in junior high school, we played AD&D 2nd Edition. I still remember my character, Magellon, a warrior. We use to play for hours and hours and hours and... I was instantly hooked.
- 2. what inspired you to write your own rpg's ? and start Golgotha Games? I had dropped out of the RPG scene for about 3 years and got rid of most of my books. I felt that playing D&D and most of the other RPGs that I had was not healthy for my walk with God, so, out they went. I had a constant nagging in the back of my head that I needed to do something, an alternative if you will. I am not saying that if you play D&D or other RPGs that you are evil, going to hell, a Satanist, or anything else, please don't misinterpret what I am saying or what we are doing. I just felt that there needed to be a quality RPG with a heavy dose of Christianity in it. After much prayer and wrestling with the Lord I started writing Spiritual Warfare the RPG (SWRPG) in January of 2000. Golgotha Games naturally grew from writing SWRPG.
- 3. how does it differ from other rpg's? The major difference between SWRPG and other RPGs is that their is a heavy Christian theme to it. While playing the game the players will memorize scripture and learn how to preach the Gospel all while killing demonic forces, it's a demon kept asking for a lot of fun! All of the SWRPG settings are based upon the fact that demons from the spiritual realm have broken through to earth and your mission is to send them back with the blow of a blade or by the Word of God.
- 4. what inspired your writing style and fantasy themes? When I started out I had never

really written anything extensive. speak with the spirits again and I just had an idea and started fleshing it out. I have learned much about writing in the past five years but I am still under constant editing.

I thought that I would take the most appealing time frame for RPGs and then go from there. I took the Tolkien type fantasy setting complete with dwarves. halflings, elves, etc. It is not Middle-Earth, but it is definitely fantasy. We also have a Western setting called 'Blaze of Glory'. A modern setting will be released this year called 'Last Days', also, a setting for adventuring in hell called 'Go To Hell' will be out later this year. We like to have a little bit of everything to appeal to as many people as possible.


5. tell us a little about your


background Okay I will try to do this as simply as I can. Where should I start? Well, along with the D&D gaming when I was in junior high I got involved with the ouija board, I quess you could say that I dabbled in Satanism a bit and did some really stupid things. I was deeply involved with the ouija to the point that I did not even need a board I could just talk to spirits. I sought after demonic power but I came to find out that Satan a LIAR and the father of lies. I remember sitting in my friends room playing with the ouija and talking to who knows what demon. My friend was on one side of the room and I was at a small desk. The human sacrifice in exchange for power and I refused wholeheartedly!!! I remember the spirit getting enraged; the window in the room began to shake violently and desk lifted off the ground and shook violently, sort of like the bed in The Exorcist. My friend was in a trance and didn't see any of it, I was spooked yet I was compelled to

A few days later I was playing with my ouija board that I made from some note book paper and a girl sitting next to me wondered what I was doing. She was a Christian and said the words my soul was longing to hear, "Do you want to be free from this?" I said yes and she invited me to church and I did what the pastors wanted me to do and I gave my heart to Jesus but only half way. I wanted the freedom of Christ with the power of Satan, pretty sick, eh? God's Word is true: a kingdom divided cannot stand, and I was divided.

I learned much about God in the next few months and got free of many of my demonic issues. I was introduced to the guitar and immersed myself in learning how to play. I was on the church worship team within a few months and then started a band with another guy in the church. I knew that I would not go back into doing the demonic things but I plunged myself into the club scene playing music, having sex, doing drugs, getting drunk, etc.

To make a long story longer, one weekend being high and drunk I felt as if there was a shotgun blast to my chest. I was terrified thinking I was having a heart attack or something. I began to see stars, my heart rate spiked and I began to see the flames of hell gripping for my soul. I knew that if I were to die I would end up in hell. Needless to say I made it through the night and then I went to the hospital the next day. The doctors said that I had a severe case of heartburn, I guess the shotgun blast was some sort of esophical hernia and they sent me home. When I got home I went into the bath room, still shaken by the images of hell and my desperate need for God. I got down on my knees and said, "No


Honest Pod Interview continued

Inside the Infinity Room by Gary

Since the inception of WTD over a year ago, one of the more popular acts to grace the stage has been the Infinity Room. I recently had the privilege to sit and converse with three of the members to learn more about this talented band.

To someone who has never heard the Infinity Room, describe yourselves in three words or less. Experimental, ethereal... we have two words that begin with "e", we need to find a third one...dynamic. What are some of your interests outside of music?

Many of the same types of things musicians generally enjoy, photography, films, some of us are into writing. We are also involved in social issues.

To me, the music world is over saturated with mediocre bands that are carbon copies of themselves. What do you believe you have to offer that is distinctive or unique? One of our biggest strengths we think is that we're not afraid to try new things. We see other groups who've just started, that have vet to put a lot of time into developing their music and have already gotten several versions of T-shirts available. That's backwards to us. We

start with the music and avoid rock star mode.

Collectively, if vou could tour with any two acts of any era or genre, who would they be and why?

That's a good one. First, the three of us would agree that the ultimate band to play with would be the Who. It comes down to Keith Moon. His "I don't care" attitude was what rock and roll was all about. Moon was a pioneer in that

After some inner debate. we'd agree on the second to be Tom Waites. We hold a lot of respect for him because he's not had a lot of commercial success, but he's still out there writing incredible songs. He also has an original and distinc-



tive voice.

The Infinity Room has a developed sound that isn't one dimensional.

There's a lot going on to which one particular instrument never dominates the song. Describe the process in which you write and arrange your songs.

It all begins with our singer. He lays out the basic structure of what he has in mind for a particular song. He never dictates. We all have input to a songs final outcome. We're not a jam band, loose and improvising. A good way to put it is that our singer writes the songs, but all of us participate in arranging. That means none of us are stifled in creative input.

What is more important to you, the music or the lyrics?

It has to be both equally. If the music is good and the words are bad, it doesn't work for us or vice versa. Many times the delivery of the vocal line is as important as the lyrics themselves.

Thanks for taking the time to talk with me. One last question.

what does the future hold for The Infinity Room?

At this point we just plan to keep going, just keep playing music.

You'll never know what an act of kindness will get you. To Honest Pod, a long time local car dealer, it got him a rock band.

I was invited to the bands studio to learn a bit of history of one of Decatur's original acts and more suc-

cessful bands. Like an old time car salesman or not, you've got to be doing something right if a heavy rock band bears vour name.

You guys have been around for a while now. what is the state of the music scene in **Decatur these** days?

It's exploded recently. Not long ago. there're weren't too many groups out

there doing it, but today, there are quite a few, especially younger bands. We believe WTD is playing a major part with it being a venue catering to original music.

bar that books acts favors a group to play music that's familiar, cover tunes. A club on the other hand, usually looks for original acts.

Where do you see Honest Pod's place in the We think we're

somewhat versatile, trying to know. We just kind of play, hit some middle ground. To be heavy enough to play with a scream-o band, but also able to fit into a bill with a much less aggressive act is where we like to be. On occasion, it can be a bit of a struggle, the bars won't allow you to play heavy.

So what is the history behind Honest Pod?

The current lineup has been intact for two years



now. As far as the name, Shane, [singer] lived a couple of houses down from Honest Pod when he was young. One Christmas, he gave Shane's mother a gift that really helped them out when they needed it. So now the band carries the name of

What inspires you to pick up your six strings and write a song?

could be a radio song, definitely.

To me, there are various types of live shows, all good in different ways. For instance, **Dream Theater is all**

about musicianship. You walk away mesmerized with their ability. Personally, NIN is about dynamics, raw emotion and energy. Then you have acts that hit a groove, whether they are electronic or such. They make you want to move. Some groups are all about a great stage show. What type of concert do you like to see? Then what type of show do vou see Honest Pod having?

We tend to like to see a real production, lights, bells and whistles. You pay
