





# Evan Marien the interview by tiavi

**at what age did you start playing the bass ?** i started playing bass when i turned 12, i was in 6th grade. i picked up the guitar and drums when i was 13.

#### What made you decide on this instrument?

It was out of necessity really, i was entering jr high school and they needed a bass player for the jazz band, so i had to learn how to read music and went right into it. When i was in high school, studying bass players like Jaco Pastorius and Victor Wooten really helped me decide that my heart was in the bass. They made me realize the bass is something more than a rhythm instrument and can have potential as a solo instrument,

while still retaining the groove.

#### what inspired you to incorporate the use of technology in your music?

Solo playing is very hard to do, especially if your a bass player. I got the idea from a bass player called Squarepusher, or Tom Jenkinson. He plays bass most of the time along with his various drum machines and laptops, and i

thought it was a fresh and original approach at how to play solo bass. It gives me complete control over what I play live also. My laptop is another musician on stage with me in my mind.

#### what are your influences?

Going back to the last question, definitely bass players such as Squarepusher. He was the one that opened the doors for bass players like me who play with laptops. Jaco Pastorius is another one, i spent 2 years studying his technique and every single one of his songs. I've incorporated a lot of that in my playing. Solid bass players are definitely an influence, like Juan Alderate of the Mars Volta. The way he can really groove is amazing. Really any bass player that can hold his own and sometimes comes out of his shell is inspiring to me.

what is your favorite song of all time?

i don't have a favorite song, just can't name one. Too many.

Well first, i am a solo bass player. that is my first project. I'm involved with my band that i play bass in

or a studio session without my Eden amplifiers. And last but not least, my laptop. It serves as my personal studio when



The Dreaming - Self-Titled EP

(2005 - Independently produced) The new project from Chris Hall (vocalist of the now defunct Stabbing Westward) and Johnny Haro (drummer of Econoline Crush), this group picks up where Stabbing Westward left off and breaks new ground. Announcing themselves with the track 'Beautiful" on the Elektra soundtrack, The Dreaming has since played numerous shows in California and self-produced a four-song EP available from their website. Describing their sound as a hybrid of screamo/alternative/electro/industrial, The Dreaming fills that gap that Stabbing Westward fans have felt since their disbanding in 2001 (and some would argue since the release of "Darkest Days"). Regardless about how you feel about the fourth 'self-titled' album, any fan of Stabbing Westward or Econoline Crush will want to follow The Dreaming.







My dad is a choir director and my mom is a piano teacher, and I started taking piano lessons when I was seven, so I grew up listening to and playing almost nothing but classical music.

I appeared to be some kind of typical girl on the outside, I suppose. Inside my heart was quite a different story. I longed to be the kind of person that drew friends. the kind of person who was attractive and vibrant. I was that kind of person in my dreams, but day after day, walked the hallways of my school feeling very alone and unwanted. What I felt about myself was reinforced at home... or was it that it was taught at home and I reinforced it to myself. Whatever the case. I thought very poorly of myself, my grades were terrible, my self-esteem was next to zero, and I walked around with a dark cloud hanging over me. Somehow there were some standards that I chose to keep, so smoking and doing drugs wasn't an option for me.

One day, I took a knife and sliced open my wrist. That was the beginning of a very secret addiction that took over my life for a few years. The first cut was in an attempt to gain attention. which didn't work. From then on it was a sport of

sorts. I didn't expect any attention for my injuries, self inflicted or not, so I cut myself to see the effects. I hurt myself and then I comforted myself. For me, being a cutter was a short lived addiction. but the cutter in me stayed long after my last cut. It's an addiction that haunts a person just like a bottle haunts the alcoholic. It's real.

Hurting myself in various ways was like doing it to another body. I felt the physical pain in the area I was harming, but my emotions staved numb to the pain. I had suppressed so much of my inner emotions and feelings for so long

that the shell around me had tougharound me to keep others out, but in some deep way had closed off my own emotional needs to myself. Not knowing how to communicate my feelings to others, I turned to self-injury as a way of coping with the pain I was feeling, numb as it seemed. I felt hopeless

After a few years, I walked away from cutting and self-injury. I found other things to fill my time with... art of every form, activities that were healthy, friendships that

were real. I took my place in society, working and just

and alone.

plain living. Things were going very well.

But then, the cutter in me raised it's ugly head once again. This time, I sat down and wrote instead of taking the

blade. I wrote and wrote; everything that was in my heart, I wrote it down. The cutter was raging inside me. and I was fighting back with all I had. But I didn't win over cutting in my own self. I depend fully on God. who for-

gave every act I did against myself, and who has new mercies every morning. I needed Someone much bigger than myself to team with me to win over the addiction. It was God in me that conquered over the destroying addiction of self-injury.

#### **Ugly Girl The Interview** By tiavi What is S.I.?

Self-Injury is an act of injuring yourself by means of cutting, burning, pulling out hair, etc. S.I. is the act of causing physical harm to your own body, usually as a way of coping with situations and conditions around you.

#### Why do you think so many feel ugly and alone especially in the underground and goth scene?

Feeling ugly is something we begin to believe about ourselves because we've heard it spoken to us by others, maybe just in fun...(or not), but just the same it's hurt us deep inside. Feeling unattractive, for whatever reason, can put a person in a depression if it's

left to fester inside. The more we believe what we think about ourselves, the deeper the hole we dig ourselves in. When we feel there's



ers us valuable human beings, we begin feeling hopeless.

I believe that in the underground and particularly the goth culture, the reason for so much low selfesteem and the rise in self-injury is that the underground culture on the whole is very outward and open about issues they face. The underground culture embraces passion and practices it; the music is loud and driving, the mosh pits are full and dynamic. The world of the underground is in your face. It's also a culture of outcasts; those who do not conform to what they've been told is acceptable. They've been shunned by their families and their peers. They carry deep wounds. They build walls around themselves and only let in a rare few.

There very well may be just as many cutters and S.I.'s in the other cultures of our generation, but they may feel they need to hide their addictions

#### What draws them into cutting?

It varies for each individual, but for many it's a way to deal with emotional pain that they can't seem to get a handle on. Their emotional pain is so deep and they've hidden deep inside for so long that reaching for a blade to cut their skin gives them real pain to deal with in place of the heart

signature blend of noise and driving bass lines but this release will appeal more to fans of Warp Records and their standouts, Autechre, B12 and Boards of Cahada.





Then, they sit back and wait for the next crisis. For some, it's experimental. What happens when I harm my body. How will my body react? What will I feel? Who will care? Usually, cutting is not a suicidal

# Do you feel it is a mental or spiritual problem and can you explain why?

As many variables that are in cutting and S.I., there would probably be that many reasons to believe that it is mental or it is spiritual. I believe that any addiction that we may find ourselves dealing with has a solution on the spiritual level. Some roots of cutting and S.I. are broken homes, abusive relationships, drugs, physical illness, and the like; but it seems apparent to me that nearly always the issue of low self-esteem plays a big part. If I don't value myself, then it's much easier to abuse my own body in whatever way I choose. If people around me send me the message that they don't value me, then that just adds fuel to my self-abusive fire.

It's definitely a mental problem that goes hand in hand with a spiritual problem. Even those who believe that there's a God and put their trust in Him, fall prey to addictions. We see it all around us. Cutting is another lie that has us bound to a blade instead of a bottle. We can try to convince people around us that we do in fact have value, but the fact remains that some people just never change. Our faith in those around us may be in vain, so instead we can turn our attention on the One who created us as masterpieces.

#### Is there Hope for a cutter?

Yes, I'm living proof that there's hope. The One who created you as a masterpiece wants to take back what is his. There's a true God for you to come to. He views you as a person of great value. He is the Master Artist, and it saddens Him to see you vandaliz

it still made Him a Savior.


