ThouShaltNot's moody and kinetic music stands apart from comparison across postpunk, goth, and electronic genres. The three-piece band is at once desperately raw and epicly refined, experimental and infectious both in concert and on their four albums.

Based in Pittsburgh, ThouShalt-Not have built strong fanbases through their national tours and their work with acts such as The Dresden Dolls, VNV Nation, Alphaville, and David J. of Bauhaus. Their club hits "Cardinal Directions," "Without Faith," "Last Comfort," and "Inside of You, In Spite of You," have been played at nearly every dark alternative and goth venue in America.

Never cliche, and constantly exploring the confluence of postpunk, industrial, folk, goth, and classical, their music, throughout its thoughtful subject matter, is psychotically hook-laden and rewardingly complex in its emotional and intellectual architecture.

#### **Interview With Don Hill** and Josh Pvle

1. You guys are both seasoned veterans in the "Christian goth/ industrial"

scene. Could you please give us some examples

of the types of things you are involved with in the scene (i.e. bands you've been a part of, music production, magazines,

Don: I do reviews for Cornerstone Festival & Magazine, and Automata

etc.)?

Magazine. I help to book bands for Cornerstone Festival. I played bass guitar for <kettleblack> between 1994 and 1996. Did a oneoff industrial project with Joe Kopnick

(KILLINGTHEOLDMAN), called Pure & Absolute. Played percussion for KTOM at C-

stone 2000. I've been doing porteur l'Image since 1998. Did one song

with Skot Shaw (Leper) under the

scrap-eater. Cornerstone 2005 mark the first live appearance of scrap-grinder, with Josh Pyle.

**Josh:** I am not into scenes. My main projects Audio Paradox and Aphorism. I helped write material for Eva O, doing sequencing and production work for both her Damnation and Salvation cd's. Many years



Josh: The seeds were first planted when I first heard Devo as a kid. I

think Blackhouse was also one of the first industrial artists I was exposed to. I heard a lot of the music on an underground Dallas station in the late 80s, mainly stuff like Cabaret Voltaire,

Ministry, Skinny Puppy, etc. My idea to start making this sort of music

started in about 1989. Since writing electronic music required either

Don: Musically it varies. Favorite artists are the [crescens collective] (Sanctum, Parca Pace, Mago, Azure Skies, etc), Mental Destruction, Skinny Puppy/ Download/cEvin Key, Revolutionary Army of the Infant Jesus, Ulf Soderberg/ Sephiroth, Caul, Tom Waits, 16 Horsepower/Woven Hand, Gridlock. Telefon Tel Aviv. and of course, Audio Paradox.;^)

Otherwise, art by Dave McKean; fiction by Charles Williams (one of the lesser known Inklings), Neil Gai-

man and Neal Stephenson; books on faith & culture/art/creativity by Steve

Scott. Steve Turner and Francis Schaeffer; and movies like 'Pi', 'Se7en', the Alien series and 'Fight Club'.

Josh: My core musical influences will probably always be Joy Divi-

New Order, David Bowie, and Kraftwerk. Beyond that, I honestly share a lot of the same ones Don listed. particularly cEvin Key/ Skinny Puppy, etc. and all the Swedish guys (see

above). Some of my other big influences would be Autechre. Aphex Twin, Amon Tobin, Ellen Allien, and Gridlock.

I'd also like to mention Twerk, an electronic artist who creates a lot of original software for music and beat production. My approach to sampling has

changed dramatically as a result. Plus it

was a gateway for me to earn more about Max/MSP.

Outside of music, other artistic influences would be Peter Saville. The Designers Republic, Chris Cunningham and Chuck Palahniuk. I also enjoyed Steve Scott and Francis Schaeffer's work.

4. Don, you are in charge of Goth/ Industrial night at the Cornerstone Music Festival. What do you look for when you are deciding which bands to book? Also, this year Goth/Industrial night has been extended to having its own stage at The Asylum all week. Do you think this is indicative of the goth/industrial scene gaining a significant foothold at Cornerstone?

Don: Pretty much artists that inspire me, both artistically and spiritually, and that I think really need to be heard. Then there's the availability factor. There have been times that I've wanted to bring someone in, but either they weren't interested or available, or our budget wouldn't allow for it.

It's not a matter of foothold. There is just such a wide variety of styles and artists that you need more than one night to do the the genre iustice.

5. Josh, the next release of Audio Paradox is becoming heavily anticipated (especially after the release of your track "Rotation" in Auto-

mata Magazine (www.automatamag.com). Are there any previews you can give us of what to expect the new album to be like, and do you have a ballpark estimate of when rabid fans can expect it?

Josh: Great question. wish I knew .:) its a matter of time, commitment and getting the technology to work.

the new album will be a lot more cohesive lyrically and sonicly will have more flow.

It is a challenge working on music long distance. I will begin updating the website and other online pages with new material within the next few months. There taste of what we can expect from this show?
