### ABSTRACT

1. Analyzed and compared spontaneous speech samples of 13 male transsexuals with those obtained from normal male and female groups and other patients. The major findings indicate that transsexuals talk more than other persons both normal and abnormal and evaluate less. The low frequency of evaluative statements was suggestive of either a poorly developed superego or great dissociative facility in changing the premise on which it operates.
