

Dear Bonze,

I am reading The Seattle Weekly: "Poets in their youth; Bryan + Shelley search for utopia" (theater) by John Fongerbaugh
 "Women's work, embroidered textiles from cloistered Korean courts" (Art) by Sheila Fan; "Picture this, Duane
 Michael's lecture, Seattle ^{art} Museum - the one that most interests me is the article about this Korean
 man, Huh Dong-hwa, who began buying old Korean embroidery in the early 60's as a hobby & it became
 an obsession for him. He had antique dealers bringing ^{him} their wares ~~to~~ he was so known. He
 discovered that the wrapping cloths, called 'pojagi', were more interesting to him than what was en-
 closed. Since little value was placed on 'pojagi' he was able to accumulate a lot of them. The problem
 became researching their origins. There is a traveling exhibit "Profusing Color" at the Seattle Asian Art
 Museum which I would like to try to get to before I leave. The pieces are 18th + 19th century +
 are patchwork, which "relate to the patchwork of Early American patchwork quilts,
 which developed simultaneously, but the Korean women had an edge - a sumptuous array of
 exotic fabrics that were unheard of among American settlers. ^{Their use says a lot} Their use of color
 points that the 'pojagi' prefigure modernism, Cubism and Constructivism in their use of color
 for abstract design. I don't agree w/ the Cubism connection because Cubism is still linked
 to representational art & involved a lot of philosophy about multiple perspectives integrated
 a one perspective fractured (perhaps better said). But I definitely like the Mondrian
 connection from what I see here in the picture. The pure abstract use of color, line +
 form plus the texture, which I have to imagine, - really appeal to me. Depending on the season
 + use (from covering a table to enclosing gifts to wrapping a ceremonial goose) the pieces ~~are~~
 made of heavy brocade to the sheerest silk or ramie gauze. I imagine I could like the
 gauze ones the best because the lines ^{on the square here} that compose fabric would interplay w/ the lines
 between the patches. Very interesting stuff. I thought you might find it so too. What
 do you think about me ^{for my} trying my hand at ^{let} making some. There certainly are enough
